- ✓ An advocate for homeowners who has never voted to raise property taxes – voted 7 times to roll back millage rate.
- ✓ Publishes all of his Council transactions online.
- ✓ Voted to strengthen the constitutionality of the Ethics Board.
- ✓ Co-sponsored and voted YES on negotiated resolution of the City, Atlanta Public Schools, Atlanta BeltLine payments.
- ✓ Voted YES for financial support for non-profits like Hosea, Feed the Hungry, seniors at Atlanta Housing Authority, West End Merchants Association, LiveThrive (CHaRM).
- ✓ Voted YES to bonds for the BeltLine trails and parks.
- ✓ Voted YES to bring Uber/Lyft/Rideshare to the airport.
- ✓ Voted to approve balanced budgets that restored City reserves, compensation for employees and public safety officers.
- ✓ Voted to protect the Ethics Office from corrupt city employees.



- ✗ Voted to raise property taxes.
- ✗ Broke her promise to voters by failing to publish all of her Council transactions online.
- ✗ Voted against strengthening the Ethics Board, jeopardizing all Ethics Board decisions/judgments.
- ✗ Voted against the negotiated resolution of the City and Atlanta BeltLine payments, putting at risk millions of dollars for our public schools.
- ✗ Voted no on funding important organizations that provide crucial support to thousands of low-income Atlantans.
- ✗ Voted against improving the trails and parks in our city.
- ✗ Voted against ride-sharing services at our airport.
- ✗ Voted against the balanced budget, putting our city services and tax dollars at risk – voted against the 7 budgets that restored/built up our \$175 million cash reserves.
- ✗ Proposed changing the term of Ethics Officer and enabling city elected officials to have more influence over the Ethics Office. This would have seriously undermined the Ethics Office.

- ▶ Co-sponsored MARTA 1/2 penny sales tax referendum.
- ▶ Co-sponsored negotiated resolution of City, Atlanta Public Schools, BeltLine payments.
- ▶ Co-sponsored CHaRM (recycling center) enabling legislation.
- ▶ Sponsored legislation for Georgia low-income housing tax credit transaction for Briarcliff Summit senior affordable high-rise rehab project.
- ▶ Sponsored legislation to strengthen city's non-discrimination ordinances.
- ▶ Sponsored legislation for Sunday alcohol sales referendum.
